**John Gioia** elected to the Contra Costa Board of Supervisors in 1998 and re-elected four times. 10 years on the East Bay Municipal Utility District Board, serving as President in 1995 and 1996. Appointed by Governor Brown in 2013 to the California Air Resources Board and has served on the Bay Area Air Quality Management District Board since 2006, serving as Chair in 2012. Served as President of the California State Association of Counties and the California Cities Counties Schools Partnership. He has been a leader on environmental issues and serves on the San Francisco Bay Conservation and Development Commission (BCDC) and as Vice-Chair of the San Francisco Bay Restoration Authority. John grew up in Richmond, graduated from El Cerrito High School and the University of California, Berkeley with a B.A. in Political Science and also earned his law degree at U.C. Berkeley. Abstract: The construction, operation, and maintenance of the transportation network is a collective effort amongst federal, state, regional, local, and other entities. This includes collecting revenues and allocating and programming funds to improve the network and achieve the goals established by decision-makers. Transportation funding involves an array of sources such as motor fuel excise taxes, sales taxes, vehicle registration fees, developer fees, etc., which are assessed at the local, state, or federal levels. This presentation provides an overview of transportation funding, while highlighting a few California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) discretionary grant programs that are available to regional and local entities.

**Matt Kelly** is an Associate Transportation Planner of the Contra Costa Transportation Authority. Matt works on various local and regional plans and studies, maintains the countywide travel demand forecasting model, and provides GIS mapping support. Abstract: An overview of TransForm's GreenTRIP program which works with cities, developers and community members to support multifamily transit-oriented development so that communities are healthier and more affordable places to live, work and get around. The program helps identify appropriate traffic reduction strategies and encourage sustainable transportation choices with options such as free transit passes, carshare memberships, and limiting excessive parking. Nina will explain GreenTRIP Certification standards, the easy-to-use, free Connect tool which predicts parking demand and vehicle miles traveled, the Parking Database and recent policy wins.
